LETTER FROM LEADERSHIP

Each year in our businesses, we see various challenges and opportunities that surface. 2022 was no different as we saw 2021 supply chain issues carry over into the new year, a volatile labor market that continued to perplex businesses of all sizes, inflation remained stubbornly high resulting in multiple interest rate hikes by the federal reserve, and geopolitical conflict has again re-emerged endangering peace and prosperity in Europe. Despite these challenges, 2022 was another banner year for SelectCobb. Our partnerships with local, state, and regional entities have positioned us to maintain our standing as a top business destination for metro Atlanta and the state of Georgia.

We have continued our economic development mission to grow jobs and investment in Cobb, help build a strong pipeline of talent, provide support to entrepreneurs and small businesses, ensure that we are an attractive location for international investment, and market Cobb County on a global scale. It is through the dedication of our staff, our partners, and the Development Authority of Cobb County that we were able to secure 22 project wins in 2022 helping to create 5,911 jobs, and over \$2.25 billion in investment that will be coming online over the next few years. Projects were secured in all areas of Cobb and they spanned all six major industry clusters. This includes the largest economic development project in Cobb County's history with the Lockheed Martin announcement of a major Research and Development operations at the Marietta facility.

At the same time, we saw three major workforce development initiatives come to fruition in Cobb: the Superior Plumbing VECTR Center at Chattahoochee Technical College, the Cobb County sheriff's ReAlign ReStart Program, and the Cobb Chamber/SelectCobb digital workforce resources page. Cobb County is again leading the way in developing innovative solutions to support businesses and help our community prosper.

I want to thank our investors and partners. It is with your leadership and support that we are able to accomplish so much year after year. Your investment in our economic development organization provides us the resources to help shape our community and have a positive impact on Cobb County. 2022 will be remembered as another great year. I cannot say thank you enough as your efforts help maintain Cobb County as Atlanta's premier business destination.





Business Walks 2022 | South Cobb 17 companies visited

On Friday, Nov. 4th partners from around the region gathered in South Cobb for a strategic concentrated business retention effort known as Business Walks. Teams from Cobb County, SelectCobb, the Mableton Improvement Coalition, and the City of Powder Springs assembled to each meet with companies to learn more about their experiences in Cobb County. Each group asked a series of questions aimed at understanding the company's current demographics including employee count, and plans for current or future growth, and assisted in identifying any issues or potential challenges the company could be facing in the county.

Through the experience, the groups met with a total of 17 companies and identified a number of challenges that were common across the companies. Each group left the event with specific tasks aimed at helping each company work through their specific challenges. Over the course of the next few months, each team reconnects with company representatives to provide additional information and resources needed to continue to help them grow and thrive in Cobb County.









WORKFORCE SUCCESSES

Cobb Workforce Partnership

The Cobb Workforce Partnership is a coalition of strategic partnerships between employers, educators, and workforce providers brought together on a platform to share best practices, discuss workforce issues, and network with industry professionals. Thus, creating an infrastructure that is consistently responsive to the everchanging Workforce Ecosystem.

Each year, partners join together to learn from one another and hear from a speaker relating to the workforce in Cobb. This year, we welcomed the Georgia Chamber, CTAE, Marietta College and Career Academy, and Cobb Innovation Center of Technology Academy leadership as they explored options that can help businesses attract and retain top talent.

Workforce Taskforce

The Workforce Taskforce, a group of over 25 business leaders, HR professionals and educators, was created in 2022. This initiative was formed by Cobb Chamber Chairwoman **Britt Fleck** and executed by SelectCobb. The taskforce is a subset of the Cobb Workforce Partnership and addresses immediate workforce challenges resulting from the pandemic.

Through this partnership, the Workforce Resources Webpage was created. The purpose of the page is to share resources and articles on topics including recruitment, retention, recognition, and culture. Thanks in part to our Strategic Partner, Georgia Power, this page is continually updated to help provide immediate guidance and solutions to employers throughout the region. ReAlign Restart

In 2022, WorkSource Cobb, Cobb County Sheriff's Department, Chattahoochee Technical College, and Construction Ready implemented "ReAlign ReStart," an on-site detainee re-entry initiative within the Cobb County Adult Detention Center. This program trains and prepares participants for jobs in a high-demand industry. In 2022, over 13 justice-involved individuals participated in the Construction Ready Pre-Apprenticeship training program where they earned eight industry-recognized credentials with employment interviews pending their release.

As new justice-involved individuals are identified for the program, additional industries will have the opportunity to participate in this innovative approach to bettering the lives of individuals in Cobb County and providing a new source of talent to build our workforce pipeline.

HR Roundtable

SelectCobb implemented a new program called the HR Roundtable. Designed for HR professionals, the quarterly event series focuses on various human resources related issues and topics aimed at assisting individuals in various industries.

SelectCobb held four luncheons with a total attendance of 150 individuals across the events. Topics included maintaining a positive culture, creating an impactful employee handbook CEO and HR Leadership, and more.

Industry Councils

In SelectCobb's first Workforce Development Study in 2015, four industry clusters, Advanced Manufacturing, Technology, Healthcare & Biotech, and Construction & Trades, were identified as being high-demand career sectors. These clusters represent industry sectors that drive strong economic growth while also providing jobs with opportunity for advancement, desirable wages, and healthy economic outlooks. Out of that conversation emerged four industry council events targeted at each industry cluster.

In late 2020, a fifth Industry Cluster, Logistics & Supply Chain, was added as a response to our everchanging workforce needs. Each Industry Council meets annually to engage in focused conversations that impact the short- and long-term workforce needs in each area. Industry experts and education leaders discuss the issues pertinent to their specific industry and innovations that are driving change.

Be Pro Be Proud

Be Pro Be Proud Georgia introduces students to technical careers through virtual and augmented reality experiences. In 2022, Be Pro Be Proud GA reached its first milestone of educating 16,000 students about jobs in skilled trades. SelectCobb is a proud supporter of the Be Pro Be Proud initiative and continues to support the program to bring access and information about skilled trades to Cobb County and Marietta City Schools students.



work experience at no risk or cost to businesses.
Internships and apprenticeships also allow employers
to know that these participants have learned the skills
and competencies needed to become invaluable to
their workforce.

The Partners in Education (PIE) Program is a collective effort of the Cobb Chamber, the Cobb County Public School System, and the Marietta City Public School System that matches businesses and organizations with schools to provide extra funding, unique services, and volunteer support.

The vision behind the Partners in Education Program is to enrich the learning experience of Cobb and Marietta students so that all develop a solid academic foundation, skills, and core values that will benefit them in their community, life, and career.

INTERNATIONAL EFFORTS

Cobb is among the leaders in the state for economic growth, global business, and innovation. International companies from 30 countries and more than 117,000 foreign-born residents now call Cobb County home. These businesses continue to foster relationships and develop connections between foreign and domestic companies. Cobb is poised for continual growth as international companies invest and expand their footprint the county.

In 2022, SelectCobb:

- Hosted seminars and webinars to share experiences and insight on the following topics: Exporting Goods/
 Services | How To Do Business in Canada | Canadian Trends/Best Practices/Partnerships
- Hosted two receptions for German and Japanese companies located throughout the region. These events
 provided a forum for companies to network and explore potential business opportunities.
- Embarked on our first external trade mission to **Québec City**, where companies were given the opportunity to hear from field experts on market trends and data analysis. Additionally, companies were paired with a Québec-based company to learn best practices and share their experiences with doing business in the city. The group spent time with the Consul General in Québec City and our partners at Québec International and the Georgia Department of Economic Development.
- Attended SEUS-CP in Savannah, where trade and investment between the Southeastern states and Canadian
 Provinces is encouraged through B2B meetings and panel discussions on relevant topics. We also attended
 the IEDC Conference in Oklahoma City, which provides the opportunity to connect with other economic
 development professionals to discuss the challenges in global commerce and offer innovative solutions.









Metro Export Challenge

SelectCobb continues to support small and medium-sized businesses in their efforts to export their goods and services abroad. The Metro Export Challenge is organized by our partners at the Metro Atlanta Chamber, whose vision is to assist companies in telling their story, developing their international marketing strategy, and exporting their products.

Winners of the challenge receive a \$5,000 reimbursement grant applicable toward internationalization costs and export mentorship assistance through federal, state, and local international trade development organizations. They also have a chance to compete for an additional \$5,000 and \$10,000 during the Pitch Day event.


